RECTOR'S LETTER

Our formal observance of Lent will begin on Ash Wednesday, March 6, with Masses at 9:30 am and 7 pm. Lent is a season of penitence and fasting imitating our Lord's practice in his wilderness experience and as a way to prepare ourselves – our souls and bodies – for the joy of Jesus' Resurrection. It is a period of 40 days' duration which culminates in the drama of Holy Week. For those who pay attention to such things, Sundays are not properly days *of* Lent, but days *in* Lent. This seemingly minor linguistic distinction speaks to the reality that Sundays are always feasts of our Lord's Resurrection and are, therefore, never penitential in essence.

On the Wednesdays following Ash Wednesday, we will have a program and simple dinner of soup and salad beginning at 6 pm in the parish hall. We will begin with the simplified and shortened form of Evening Prayer, have supper, move into our program, and end with the shortened office of Compline, "At the Close of the Day."

Our program will be based on the Lenten Meditations published by Episcopal Relief and Development. These daily meditations will provide ample food for prayer and thought during this vital season and are available at the rear of the church. Should you be unable to attend, please let the office know and we will be happy to see you receive a copy.

While Lent is most assuredly about our sins, known and unknown, things done and left undone, it is, at

its heart and center, about new life in Jesus Christ. Barbara Brown Taylor, priest and author, has called sin "the language of salvation," provocative though that is and assuredly joyful, as it should be.

Please join your fellow members to explore just how it is that our sin may lead to our salvation; an insight voiced by Paul and later affirmed by the brilliant and sympathetic Julian of Norwich.

Daily Meditation: A very special day. Ash Wednesday

The ashes we use are the burnt palms from last year's celebration of Passion Sunday. We begin our Lenten journey aware of where we are going. We want to enter the Passion, Death, and Resurrection



of Jesus for us more fully.
That is the purpose of our journey. It is why we mark our heads with his cross. It is why we fast today and abstain from meat. Our Lenten program is not an

effort to save ourselves. We have been saved by <u>his</u> <u>sacrifice</u>. Our self-denial helps us, in the darkness that surrounds us, to prepare ourselves to receive his light. For this is a journey to the Easter font, where we will renew the promises of our Baptism, remembering that in dying with him in the waters of Baptism, we are reborn with him to everlasting life. This year's journey begins today.

"Yet even now, says the LORD, return to me with your whole heart, with fasting, and weeping, and mourning; Rend your hearts, not your garments, and return to the LORD, your God. For gracious and merciful is he, slow to anger, rich in kindness, and relenting in punishment." *Joel 2:12-13*

Teach us to be loving, not only in great and exceptional moments, but above all in the ordinary events of daily life. May we abstain from what we do not really need and help our brothers and sisters in distress. May we bear the wounds of your Son in our bodies, for through his body he gave us life.

Prayer: On this special day, Ash Wednesday, may our sacrifices in fasting and prayer be a way to clear away the clutter in our lives to see you more clearly. Lord, I know there is distraction within me and around me. In these coming days let your Light shine in the darkness. Help me long for that Light until we celebrate it at the Vigil six weeks from now. And most of all Lord, help me to honor this day with the ashes on my forehead. May it help me remember where I have come from and where I am going. Lord, I acknowledge to you my sins and my deep need for your loving forgiveness and grace. I pray that this Lenten season that you will make me so much more aware of how much I need your healing in my life. May the Lord bless us, protect us from all evil, and bring us to everlasting life. Amen.

• Simple Supper with program in Parish hall.

We will begin with a shortened form of Evening Prayer,"In the Early Evening," and conclude with a shortened form of Compline, "At the Close of Day." These are found in the BCP on pp 139 and 140.
