RECTOR'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Living across the street from an elementary school is a unique experience. Every morning there is a sudden rush of energy,



and cars, right outside the church. Students, parents, and teachers, with haste and excitement, begin the school day, now inperson or online. For a few hours, Bellefonte looks busier than usual. Then, just as suddenly as the day began, it all stops. The bell rings, the school day ends, and the busyness disappears. The cars magically vanish, and the grassy field and blacktop filled with the echo of kids' voices are silent until the morning.

While many of us gave up being students many years ago, the ebb and flow of school has caught our collective attention. We've been following what schools are doing (and not doing) this year. Of course, parents and teachers have had to get creative this year. This month, join me in lifting up and praying for our educators and support staff -those teaching at home and in school.

Through all this I have been impressed by the tenacity of all children and youth. They have had to adjust, and readjust, their daily lives more than anyone else.

Our children and youth have had to adapt; they've had to take the lead from others, to make the best of our current situation. In many ways, we're all a bit like children right now: following guidelines, finding ways to have fun without breaking the rules, and trying to stay within the boundaries of what is right and safe. I know it hasn't been easy; I look at our children and youth with great admiration.

During September, I hope to explore what our common life as a parish



might look like moving forward. We will continue following our reopening guidelines, while exploring how we might adapt and develop for a richer church experience. With this in mind, I have created a Parish Life Survey. The survey is made up of brief questions, some multiple

Netflix, Hulu, Amazon Prime, and a host of other on-line streaming services are experiencing record-breaking sales of subscriptions. I am amazed at how many of us are coping with this change of lifestyle.

One thing that might have changed during this pandemic is **Prayer.** Are we praying more, maybe meditating more, or reading scripture daily? How about sitting still and letting God talk to you or watching a podcast of your favorite preacher give a sermon. Our own Fr. Carlos is offering fantastic sermons these days; are we listening?

If you answered no to any of the above, do not beat yourself up over it; a good portion of people are not. and prayers of the people. I would go through my list of what I wanted to pray for.

As you all know, we have much to pray for. To make a long story short, believe me: I'm trying. I noticed I didn't need my music any longer; but my desire to pray and to talk to God made this a desired habit to be in communication with God on my walks. The phrase "Divine Intimacy" comes to mind. As St. Alphonsus stated, the practice of prayer frees our soul to be in unison with Christ. I hope you may all experience this life of prayer. Peace to all of you, and pray for me as I pray for you.




