RECTOR'S LETTER

Dear friends,

The month of May promises to be filled with great Easter joy. While every Sunday is a celebration of our Lord's



Resurrection, we will witness the on-going transformative power of the Resurrection in the life of the Church as we celebrate two adult Baptisms and a Confirmation mass. Emily Sterk and Jeff Wilson will both be baptized (at separate Sunday masses) in May. On Saturday, May 14, teens and adults will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation as they confirm the faith and grace given to them in Baptism.

This Easter joy will be further augmented by our second Choral Evensong & Benediction service of the year on **Sunday**, **May 22**: Rogation Sunday. If you attended our first Evensong & Benediction in February, you know that you're in for a treat. Erik Clayton and our choir offered a fine service, and I look forward to the next one.

That same day, we have the pleasure to welcome back Ted Christopher, who by then will be the Rev. Ted Christopher, to Saint John's pulpit. Ted will preach at both our 9:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. masses. The latter

will include an outdoor blessing of the parish garden and coffee hour for Rogation Sunday. A few days later, on **Thursday, May 26**, we will celebrate Ascension Day with Low Mass with organ and cantor and a parish dinner. There is more information on all these



offerings later in this issue of *The Herald*. It will be a festive month at Saint John's.

As we celebrate the feasts and Sacraments of the Church, we do so while remaining keenly aware of the various tragedies that plague the human family of God. As I write this letter, our breakfast fundraiser for Ukraine is scheduled to take place on Saturday. While I don't have any figures or comments to share with you at this time, I pray that it will be a success. I hope that we will raise as much money as possible; and that our contribution, no matter how small or large, will serve the most vulnerable in Ukraine.

Through our Lord's death and Resurrection, we're able to celebrate Christ's victory over death while we grieve for the suffering and dead. We're able to do this because we believe that Christ's resurrection has filled all human grief—in small and large quantities; immediately or in due time—with hope. This hope is rooted in one of the central outcomes of our Lord's Resurrection: God's vindication of Jesus on the third day. Through the Resurrection event, Christ's vindication over the evil forces of this world and death itself becomes ours.

Earlier this week, I witnessed this great
Easter hope in news reports of Easter
celebrations in Ukraine. Even in the midst of
war, churches were full—Christians shouted
"Christ is risen!" and offered their prayers
and lit votives. As we continue to journey
through this Easter season, let us join our
Christian siblings in Ukraine and celebrate
God's victory over death, and pray that we
may more fully see Christ's victory in our
day.

What shall we make of this: we renewed our baptismal vows, we lit our candles at the vigil, and lit the Pascal candle to commemorate our new journey toward Pentecost. On that day, Sunday, June 5, we will celebrate the descent of the holy spirit. What are we to do in the meantime? We hear scripture stories of Jesus in the upper room breaking bread with his apostles (the women were also present). We also hear stories of the apostles healing and preaching. One of my favorite stories in the gospels is from John

quoted above. You have heard me say many times that I resonate with Peter, but I feel especially connected to Jesus's words paraphrased, "Alex, do you love me?" I reply, "Yes, Lord! I Love You." "Then feed my sheep." "Feel free to add your own name: "[Your Name], do you love me?" "Then feed my sheep."

One of the beautiful things about our parish is that we are not so big that we lose track of each other. As a church family we accomplish so much. We call on each other in many ways, and we do ministries as Jesus would have liked it: "Feed my sheep." The youth of St. John's are working on projects for Out Of The Cold, as well as for PAWS. This is how we are feeding our sheep.

I will resume visiting Centre Care on a regular basis beginning in May. The men's spiritual group will be starting a new book on **May 2**, meeting outside at my home each




Monday night at 7 p.m. I invite you to come and join us for this study.

reside in Morgantown, West Virginia. Mark is the son of Heidi and Mark, Sr.




