Hello, church! My name is Kevin Lowe, and I am so excited to be serving with you as your seminarian for the next two years. I am in the process of ordination for priesthood in the diocese, and I am going into my second year of seminary coursework at Bexley Seabury Seminary in Chicago. Bexley Seabury is a nonresidential seminary, so my classmates (and teachers) live all over the country. We study and worship together online and meet in Chicago a few times a year for retreats. As part of the seminary program, we do two full years of field education, learning hands-on about ministry in a local context. I'm really excited to learn from Fr. Carlos, Deacon Alex, and everyone at Saint John's.

A little bit about me: I was born and raised Roman Catholic, but found my way to the Episcopal church in 2014. My wife, Sarah, and I have been members at St. Andrew's in State College ever since. I am also a historian (I did a PhD in American religious history at Penn State) and a professional musician. Our Christian education program took off with a


splash this year. On Sunday, Aug. 28, our

and Learning at Bald Eagle State Park. Our day began with a worship service and communion followed by a barbecue (thanks,




ST. FRANCIS FAMILY DAY




