RECTOR'S LETTER

Dear Friends,



On the very first day of November, after we have consumed bags of Halloween candy, the Church Catholic celebrates an important feast: the Solemnity of

All Saints. On this day we rejoice in one voice for all the Saints of God, those chosen vessels of God's grace and the lights of the world in their generations.

In observance of this great feast, we will celebrate All Saints Day proper on Tuesday, November 1, at 5:30 p.m. with Low Mass, accompanied by organ and cantor, followed by a delicious Mexicaninspired dinner. We will also keep the Octave of All Saints, on Sunday, November 6. So, you'll have two chances to sing "For All the Saints" this year!

The week after our All Saints Octave, on Sunday, November 13, we will once again observe Remembrance Sunday. This is a day in which we commemorate the contributions of military and civilian servicemen and women in the two World Wars. As has become our custom, at least since my arrival, we will also observe our All Souls remembrance that

day and read the names in our parish necrology. To aid in our solemn observance, our choir will be offering Victoria's *Requiem, Missa Pro Defunctis* (Mass for the Dead), at the 10:30 a.m. service

The last two Sundays in November mark, respectively, the feast of Christ the King and the First Sunday of Advent, the beginning of the Church year. November inaugurates not only a solemn period in our liturgical year, but also the start of our stewardship campaign.

By now, you should have received a letter inviting you to join me in making a financial pledge to support the ministries and mission of Saint John's. I hope that you will consider joining me and vestry in making a pledge to sustain and further strengthen the work and witness of this parish.

May God, who has given us, in the lives of his saints, patterns of holy living and victorious dying, strengthen your faith and devotion, and enable you to bear witness to the truth against all adversity.





St. John's Episcopal Church Vestry Meeting September 21, 2022

Rector's Report:

- Evensong this Sunday.
- Feast Day Michaelmas, Thursday, September 29 (since changed to Wednesday, September 28).
- Sunday School cancelled until October 9th due to Ellen's absence.
- Family Day Program
 - o Saturday October 1st for all families with young children.
- Formation for Teens
 - o Sunday, October 2
 - o Once a month led by Father Carlos, Kevin Lowe, and Haley Rhone.
 - Pilgrimage to Washington DC Trip would be in June.
 - o Floor Repair Moving along nicely.
- Shaped by Faith Grant
 - o Submitted for \$11K beginning in September for choral music.
 - o St. John's along with Penn State School of Music and Penn State Campus ministry.
 - o If we don't receive the funds the program will not happen.
- Blessing of the Animals
 - o October 9. Father Carlos wouldn't be able to attend; therefore, Father Kevin will be asked to oversee.
- Clean Up Day
 - o Need to schedule a clean-up day of garden beds.
 - o Looking at October 29th from 9-12.

Treasurer Report:

- Everything ok.
- Pledges a bit lacking.
- Budget overages
 - o Alter Guild budget is over because of Blanche Raymond's and Diane Fusco's funerals; however, had money come in which offsets.
 - o Miscellaneous Income is at \$10K but expenses are \$9,673.
 - This is due to the columbarium addition, which is reflected in the expenses.
 - o Gas it was a cold winter.
 - o Supply Priest
 - Will have another \$200 because of Father Kevin.
 - Budgeted amount didn't change but we also paid Ted Christopher, which wasn't planned.
 - o Father Carlos commented that we hope to foster relationships with the greater Centre County community that will benefit us. The grant is an example of this effort.
 - o Reality of budget when we planned the budget, we hoped to get some new pledges, but this didn't happen. Some pledges won't be met due to death.


Senior Warden

- Floor pretty much complete. Some minor things to be completed. Some things won't be put back into place until new altar platform arrives.
- Thank you to Jeff Wilson for all his work.
- Looking forward to fall clean-up.

New Business

- Boiler Block
 - o This has arrived after a six month wait. Ready to install.
 - o Father Carlos proposed do we want to allocate funds from the Eby Estate or from the \$20K gift received for maintenance?
 - Question was asked concerning any downside? Answer was no.
- Bats/Birds Issue
 - o Bat droppings still happening.
 - Father Carlos contacted a contractor to inspect the issue. He was here for two hours. Found numerous areas where bats/birds were entering.
 - o Contractor's proposal was to install and fill those areas where the stone meets the roof, behind the gutters, and fill in main entry areas.
 - o Amount proposed was \$8K.
 - o Question about what would deter the bats/birds from finding other entry areas. Cold/Hot allows for gaps over the years.
 - o L. Helms thought we should do this because we have the funds and do it sooner rather than later.
 - o Questions about a possible bat box.
 - o L. Roberson commented that there are a few things we have to do for other access points. Would like to get other quotes.
 - o M. Perkins have we viewed any other work this contractor has done so that we can see what finished product would look like?
 - Father Carlos will schedule a time for Larry/Matt and the contractor to meet to ask additional questions, then bring it back to vestry by next meeting.
 - o Motion for how we are going to pay \$8K.
 - Father Carlos asked to approve a resolution from the \$20K received for mitigation, then separately approve the actual contractor.
 - Father Carlos said that for the steeple we need a mason to get up on a lift.
- Photo Directory
 - o Took lots of pictures but still missing many.
 - o A general email will go out, then an email to the specific people will follow.
